2. Methodology:


The Google Forms survey was designed to cover five major parameters:

- > Teacher's Fairness and Sincerity



By the google form reports shows the following responses from the 79 students.




Our college has been run the two courses which is BSW and MSW where the responses given by 50.6% students from MSW and 49.4% students from BSW.







































4. Analysis Findings:

Parameter 1: Overall Course Difficulty:

The analysis of Google Forms responses revealed that the majority of students found the MSW course to be challenging (58.18%), while the BSW course showed a more balanced distribution of students' perceptions, with 43.75% finding it challenging, 25.00% manageable, and 31.25% easy.

Parameter 2: Course Syllabus Coverage:

Data analysis of Google Forms submissions indicated that a significant number of students from both MSW and BSW courses reported that more than 85% of the syllabus was covered. Specifically, 53.85% of MSW students and 59.38% of BSW students acknowledged substantial coverage.

Parameter 3: Teacher's Approach and Preparedness:

According to the responses received via Google Forms, the teachers' approach and preparedness were perceived to be effective by the majority of students. Approximately 75.76% of students found the teacher's preparation always effective, and 68.18% acknowledged that teacher communication was always effective.

Parameter 4: Teacher's Encouragement and Support:

The data collected through Google Forms revealed that most students felt encouraged to participate in class discussions, with 80.77% of students agreeing that teachers always encouraged student involvement. However, there were some concerns regarding regular course feedback, as 38.46% of students reported that they did not receive feedback regularly.

Parameter 5: Applicability of Course to Real-Life Situations:

A substantial number of students from both MSW (56.25%) and BSW (62.50%) courses acknowledged the applicability of the courses to real-life situations.

Parameter 6: Teacher's Fairness and Sincerity:

In terms of fairness and sincerity, the majority of students perceived the teachers' approach (84.62%) and internal assessment (50.00%) to be fair.

5. Conclusion:

Based on the analysis of the student feedback collected through Google Forms, the College of Social Work, Kamptee, has received positive feedback regarding the overall course structure, syllabus coverage, and teachers' effectiveness. However, there are areas that require attention, such as enhancing regular course feedback and reinforcing the practical applicability of the courses.

6. Recommendations:

Considering the analysis findings, the following recommendations are proposed for further enhancement:

- ✓ Encourage faculty members to leverage digital tools like Google Forms for more streamlined and efficient feedback collection.
- ✓ Organize periodic workshops and training sessions for faculty to improve pedagogical approaches, ensuring the courses are more student-centric and application-oriented.
- ✓ Strengthen the collaboration between academic departments and industries/NGOs to foster real-life exposure and hands-on experience for students.





























Key Findings:

- 1. **Job Status:** Out of the total respondents, the majority (75%) are employed, while some are still studying for competitive exams or working in social work initiatives.
- 2. **Monthly Income:** The salary distribution of the employed alumni varies, with the majority earning between Rs. 10,000 to Rs. 15,000 per month.
- 3. Alumni Pride: Over 90% of the alumni feel proud to be associated with CSW Kamptee.

- 4. **Knowledge Acquisition:** Almost all respondents (95%) believe that they obtained sufficient knowledge in both theory and practice during their time at CSW Kamptee.
- 5. **Relevance to Career:** A significant majority (88%) find the learning at CSW Kamptee relevant and beneficial for their careers.
- 6. **Student Life Improvement:** Many alumni (75%) suggested areas for further improvement in student life at CSW Kamptee.

Facilities and Services:

- 1. **College Development:** Around 85% of the respondents believe that the college's development is beneficial for students.
- 2. Curriculum: Over 80% of the alumni find the curriculum appropriate for learning and employability.
- 3. **Teachers and Staff:** The vast majority (92%) feel that teachers facilitate the overall development of students, and the principal, office staff, and faculties are cooperative.
- 4. **Library:** The library facilities are considered good and adequate by 88% of the respondents.

Job Placement Cell:

- 1. **On-Campus Opportunities:** Approximately 80% of the alumni agree that the Job Placement Cell provides on-campus opportunities.
- 2. **Off-Campus Opportunities:** A similar percentage (78%) also feels that the Job Placement Cell offers off-campus opportunities.
- 3. **Information Provision:** The Job Placement Cell is appreciated for providing ample information to students.

Alumni Engagement:

- 1. **Alumni Association:** Around 80% of the respondents support the formation of an Alumni Association at CSW Kamptee, considering it a positive step.
- 2. **Academic Strengthening:** More than 70% believe that alumni play a vital role in the academic strengthening of the college.
- 3. **Involvement in Activities:** A significant percentage (75%) of the alumni feel that CSW Kamptee involves its alumni in various activities.

Suggestions for Improvement:

The most common suggestions provided by the alumni for further improvement include enhancing the placement cell's efforts to secure better job opportunities, focusing on practical learning, conducting more workshops and seminars, and improving infrastructure facilities.
